After graduate school, I moved back to Los Angeles and spent 17 years there before moving back east to New York City. Just this year, I left NYC for Greenwich, Connecticut.

**School Daze.** I went to Syracuse University for my undergraduate degree where I studied art education. Thereafter, I went to New York University for graduate school for art dealership and collecting. I also went to Loyola Marymount for a graduate degree in Child & Adolescent Literacy.

**The J.O.B.** I am a floral designer. It is my dream job! I get to be creative, work with beautiful flowers and plants, and design environments that make people happy. I am lucky in that my studies in college and graduate school inform my career as a floral designer. I took a ton of art history classes, including 17th century Dutch still-life painting, which almost always includes flowers. Other influential art classes were color theory, drawing, sculpture, and painting. I wonder sometimes if I would have been drawn to a career as a floral designer had it been offered as a major in college. Yet, when I look back at all of my experiences and studies, they seem entirely relevant to what I am doing today.

**Daytime Reverie:** These days, I find myself daydreaming a lot about how truly blessed I am for my life, just as it is. It is perfectly imperfect. My family is healthy and happy. I have wonderful friends. I live in a lovely new town with a welcoming community and I enjoy my career. It delights me to think about all of the details, from the table setting to the menu to the music that plays in the background. I also dream of one day having a home with enough backyard space to plant a garden filled with flowers and organic vegetables

# YOU HAVE HAD A MOST INTERESTING CAREER PATH, TELL US ABOUT IT.

#### You worked in the Gagosian Gallery in Beverly Hills. How did you get that job?

My first gallery position was an internship at the Leo Castelli Gallery in New York City while in graduate school at NYU. Upon completion of the internship, I accepted a position as the assistant registrar for the André Emmerich Gallery, also located in New York. After dealing with one too many snowy winters in New York, I was ready to experience life on the west coast. As luck would have it, Gagosian was opening a gallery in Beverly Hills. I submitted a resume for the front desk position and the rest is history.

## Then you moved on to become a toy designer for a major toy manufacturing company. How did you transition from working in an art gallery to designing toys?

While I truly enjoyed working in the art world, I was interested in something else, which I had not yet pursued. I have always loved working with children and wanted to give teaching a try. I was specifically interested in helping children with learning challenges, so I took a position at Brentwood School in Los Angeles. Subsequently, I earned a master's degree in education and began to create original games to help my students learn basic skills. What started as a fun project turned into a real business. I took a chance on myself and started my own company called <a href="Beyond Learning">Beyond Learning</a> designed, manufactured, and distributed eco-friendly educational games all over the world. The esteemed Dr. Harvey Karp (<a href="Happiest Baby on the Block">Happiest Baby on the Block</a>) helped with the company's tag line: "Getting smart is just half the fun!".

## Now you are a floral designer. Did that happen by chance or was floral design something you have been working towards for some time?

Totally by chance. After more than a decade in the toy industry, I felt ready for a career change. I wanted to find something that would allow me to use my creativity and simultaneously provide a connection to nature. There was a flower school a few blocks away from where I lived in New York City. One afternoon, I stopped in to inquire about taking a class. When I opened the door to the school, the first thing I noticed was the enchanting smell of fresh flowers, which instantly took me back to the gardens in California and made me feel at home. The woman who greeted me at the door described with immense passion the world of floral design. After talking to her for about 30 minutes, she encouraged me to take the only remaining spot in an upcoming professional program. That was it. I never looked back.

# TELL US MORE ABOUT YOUR PROFESSION AS A FLORAL DESIGNER.

### What is your aesthetic?

I would say that it is a delicate balance between west coast grace, Manhattan sophistication, and New England elegance. The aesthetic that influences my work stems from all of my life experiences.

#### Has your love of flowers opened you up to a passion for scents?

I think back to my grandparents' garden in Harrison, NY, where my cousin, Lisa, and I would smell all of the roses and pick our favorites. My love of flowers has always been connected to scents. When people receive a bouquet of flowers, they look first at the presentation and then smell the flowers. Flowers and scents go hand in hand.

## Tell us a bit more about your business model. We understand that you only take a select number of clients each year. What's behind that decision?

<u>Jill Gaynor Design</u> takes on a select number of clients so that I can give each client bespoke service. I always want the people with whom I work to feel as though I am their own personal florist.

#### What are some of the challenges of operating your own business?

Flowers are seasonal. I've received desperate pleas for last-minute peonies in February when they are out of season. It's like asking for snow during the summer.

#### What do you love most about what you do?

I love almost everything about being a floral designer. It is a joy working with each of my clients and coming up with designs that they are excited about. I cannot think of a more rewarding way to earn a living. I get to be creative and make people happy every day. I also love and respect the people that I have met in this industry. The floral design community is filled with talented, kind, creative, supportive, and very hard-working professionals. I feel privileged to be a part of it.


# YOU RECENTLY MOVED FROM NEW YORK CITY TO GREENWICH, CONNECTICUT.
